Welcome

"I wait for the LORD, my whole being waits, and in his word I put my hope." (Psalm 130:5-6)

These are strange days. Everybody has been impacted by Covid-19, but no two people's experiences are exactly the same. One friend, whose wife was recently diagnosed with dementia, said that

lockdown had been a "real blessing". Others have appreciated the novelty of a slower pace and different routines, a chance to hear birds singing. But for many there is grief, fear, anxiety, uncertainty, trauma and stress. Is there any hope to be found? The brutal fate of George Floyd is one grim reminder – among many - that a vaccine for Covid-19 is not the ultimate answer.

The Psalmist recognises that the only true source of hope is in God and his word. This isn't a hope that airbrushes out the difficulties. After all, the Psalm begins with raw honesty: "Out of the depths I cry to you, LORD". It's a hope rooted in God - his faithfulness, his action in history - and in his Word.

That's why, this year, in the new online **Virtually Keswick Convention**, the theme is Hope. Our Bible Readings in the morning with Christopher Ash will speak of Hope in Jesus from the Psalms. Every day there will be a seminar that explores hope from a different angle. One will look at hope amidst grief and trauma, another at hope and crying out honestly to God. In the evenings, a celebration will highlight a different aspect of the hope found in Jesus Christ. There's a great programme for children and youth, too. Programme launched!

Join us from 27 until 31 July at Virtually Keswick Convention!

Morning Bible readings, seminars and Evening Celebrations as well as a lively children and youth programme will be held, all based on the theme of hope. Prayer times and devotions for adults with learning disabilities will also take place. there will also be additional events – an Awesome Cutlery concert and Keswick Unconventional Night Shift.

The programme is available on our new Virtually Keswick Convention website. (https://vkc.keswickministries.org/) During the online Convention, sessions will be livestreamed on the website and also via Keswick Convention YouTube. The sessions will also be available to watch after the sessions have taken place.

From Tuesday to Friday, there will prayer meetings each morning led by Jodi Whitehouse and Matt Searles.

The morning programme includes Bible readings by Christopher Ash and daily seminars by speakers including Jo Jackson, Rico Villanueva and panel led by Adrian Reynolds.

Evenings feature our usual Celebrations, with faithful and engaging Bible teaching and sung worship led by Emu. Speakers are Mike Cain, Andy Prime, Amy Orr-Ewing, Graham Daniels and Jeremy McQuoid.

Mike Cain will speak on the theme of Why Hope? looking at the passage of 2 Thessalonians 2:13-17, while Andy Prime will preach about How can I hope? looking at 1 Peter.

Amy Orr-Ewing will speak about the Scriptures as a reason for hope, looking at Romans 15. Graham Daniels will preach on the theme of Our Hope: the appearing of Jesus Christ focusing on Titus 2.

Jeremy McQuoid will end this year's Convention, preaching on the theme of Our hope: The glory of God, focussing on Romans 5.

Short devotions for adults with learning disabilities will be held each day by Count Everyone In.

A lively programme for children and youth features Bible teaching that we pray will help the children and young people to know and love our great God more.

Musical ministry duo Awesome Cutlery will be leading families in sung worship on Tuesday afternoon.

Keswick Unconventional, which engages with life and faith through the arts, will be holding a Night Shift event on Wednesday after the Evening Celebration.

Be encouraged to join with us for five days of engaging biblical teaching as we look at the theme of hope in Jesus Christ.

Some churches are thinking (depending on regulations, of course) of gathering groups of children or young people together to watch the daily Keswick streams.

Others are looking at planning church-wide activities.

We hope that you will be able to join in too!

Other dates for your diary:

On Sunday 26 July, the Keswick Convention will be featured on BBC Radio 4 Sunday Worship. The service will include the feel of past Keswick Conventions as the programme will have Emu music recordings from the main tent in previous years. Chris Wright, International Ministries Director of the Langham Partnership, is preaching and the service will include a testimony and music from Cathy Burton, one of Keswick Unconventional's artists.

Finance update – a word from our Treasurer

I wanted to give you an update on our finances. I know that with all that has happened this year due to Covid many of our supporters have questions about how the Ministry is now placed.

As you know Keswick Ministry relies on the generosity of our supporters. It is through your continued faithful giving over the last 145 years that Keswick Ministries has been able to positively impact hundreds of thousands of lives not only in the UK, but across the world.

Several thousand children, teens and adults attend the Convention each year to join fellow Christians from around the world to study God's Word together. The Convention offers them a special, much-needed time away from the pressures of every-day life and a place of great spiritual refreshment. Throughout the year Keswick Ministries also offers free resources, books, audio and video material, and Bible-centred training designed to equip Christians in their walk with the Lord.

We are very fortunate that many of you have set up direct debits, and are thankful to you for this. This provides a regular and reliable income, which goes a long way to covering the $\pounds 1.3m$ of annual operating costs incurred in running the Ministry. Other income comes from car parking, the letting of facilities and, of course, the one-off giving, which would normally occur during the Convention.

As you will be aware the 2020 Convention, as a physical gathering, has been cancelled due to Covid-19 and so, whilst we have avoided much of the cost of putting it on, we are aware that our income will also be significantly reduced. There will be costs in staging the Virtually Keswick Convention, and so it is anticipated that there will be a deficit in our finances this year.

The purpose of this note is to ask you to prayerfully consider how you might be able to contribute to ensure that there isn't a shortfall in funds in 2020, and to ensure that the Ministry can continue throughout 2021 and beyond.

We greatly appreciate any gifts supporting the Ministry, but fully understand that in the current circumstances some will not be able to give. We are very grateful for everyone's ongoing support.
