^{v22}The steadfast love of the LORD never ceases; his mercies never come to an end; ²³they are new every morning; great is your faithfulness (Lamentations 3:22-23)



Changes are happening fast, unpredictably, and there's a sense of foreboding as the dark clouds of Covid-19 and the economic, relational, and emotional storms swirl around.

Against that backdrop, next summer's Convention theme is "Faithful". Confidence in the faithfulness of God is not an act of make-believe. It's not something we have to twist God's arm for or hope for. Our sin doesn't thwart it. Our unfaithfulness doesn't jeopardise it. Our anguish doesn't diminish it. Those words from Lamentations, chosen to go with the Convention theme, are wonderfully comforting and reassuring, but they are not glib or trite. They come in the midst of "smoke, ruin and despair" (Dale Ralph Davis). No, faithfulness is rooted in God's character, and is seen in history, supremely in Jesus Christ. No wonder Lamentations moves from talking *about* God to talking *to* God: "Great is *your* faithfulness."

May we look to the faithful God, every day.

It's a great opportunity to make a number of our courses accessible online.

Emerging Leaders

Next month we are holding an Emerging Leaders course online. Fifteen participants will be joining the course, via Zoom, with James Robson, Simon Barrington, Naomi Partidge, Simon Potter and Bishop Emma Ineson. The course is for those in their 20s and 30s in leadership, and will look at how they can be inspired and better equipped to lead radically and authentically now and in the future.

Also in October, at the request of previous delegates, we'll be starting monthly workshops in Hebrew for those at intermediate plus level. These sessions will be taking place for the next 6 months.

Two free online events will be held on Thursday 15th October in partnership with Faith in Later Life.

Doctrine Study Day

We're delighted to be holding a Doctrine Study Day in partnership with the Pastors' Academy at London Seminary, in Keswick, on 26th November.

This is a great opportunity to be refreshed in the beautiful Lake District and receive rich teaching.

Neil Martin will bring some of the best of recent biblical scholarship that demonstrates an incarnational Christology, and Garry Williams will draw insights from the high points of patristic reflection and analytic theology to help us understand more of the coherence and implications of the biblical doctrine.

Garry said: "We are very excited to make some of the wonderful insights in this rich literature accessible for pastors. Our desire is that we would honour the Son by speaking, teaching, and preaching rightly of him. What could be more important in our theology?"

Registrations for the course are now open. Measures are being put in place to ensure we are Covid-compliant and following Government guidelines.
