Jesus said, "The Spirit of the Lord is on me, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners..." (Luke 4:18)



A friend and trustee of Keswick Ministries posted a short extract from Dietrich Bonhoeffer's *Letters and Papers from Prison* on Facebook. Bonhoeffer was a German church leader and theologian who spoke out against Hitler and Nazism, and was imprisoned and then executed.

"Life in a prison cell may well be compared to Advent; one waits, hopes, and does this, that, or the other—things that are really of no consequence—the door is shut, and can be opened only from the outside."

The words resonate well with the current time. In the historic church calendar, this is the season of Advent, when Christians look forward to the return of Christ to rule and reign. And this is also the season of lockdown, when so many of us feel acutely the ongoing restrictions and that the "door is shut, can be opened only from the outside".

It is into this context that the words of Jesus – from his manifesto in Luke's gospel – speak. He comes to "proclaim freedom for the prisoners". And this freedom from sin, from death, from judgement, is something we can experience now, whatever our circumstances. And Advent reminds we look forward to full realisation of it.

It's been a joy when we've been able to meet again in person in our churches, though of course for many that's not been possible.



Derwent Project update: Phase One work starts at Pencil Factory



Contractors have started Phase One of the major transformation of the former Pencil Factory.

Work will include the installation of toilets, meeting rooms, large multi-purpose areas and a reception to the ground floor as well as installing power and heating throughout the building.

The plan is that this work would be completed in time for next year's summer Convention so that the ground floor can be used during the event.

The aim of the Derwent Project is to be a beacon of spiritual refreshment to give more Christians of all ages opportunities to worship, study God's Word and encourage each other during the Convention and throughout the year. It aims to inspire future generations of children and young people to follow Jesus, to love the Bible and to grow strong in their faith and to ensure that church leaders, mission workers and Christians from all walks of life benefit from more training events and resources developed by Keswick Ministries.

The refurbishment, costing £10.5 million, will be carried out in three phases and will be completed by 2024.

Work has taken place to restore and reinstate the iconic letters 'The Home of Cumberland Pencils' on the Pencil Factory.

David Sawday, Chief Operating Officer for Keswick Ministries, said: "We are so thankful to the thousands of supporters who have generously made this refurbishment possible. While it will always be "The Home of Cumberland Pencils" we are also looking forward to its new role during next year's Convention and beyond as a centre for Christian teaching, Conferences, events and local uses."








Dear friends,






Pray, Persevere and Joy, Food for the Journey devotionals


These daily devotionals help you study the Scriptures with a Keswick teacher by your side. They are packed with Gospel truths, encouraging messages and thoughtful reflections.
