Welcome

These have been, and are, difficult days. The year has been hard for so many and the impact remains very real. Nonetheless, there

are signs that, in the UK at least, the worst is behind us and that there is a government roadmap towards greater normality.

Keswick Ministries Trustees and team have been praying much, and wrestling with what is the right thing to do this summer. We're conscious that Christians will have different views as to the appropriate way forward. While all are desperate for life to return to normal, there is a huge spectrum of opinion on when and how that should happen.

Some are bold, optimistic, feeling that the vaccine roll-out and the government road map mean that it is obvious the Convention should take place this summer. Why should the Convention be different from the many other festivals and events that are planning to go ahead?

Others are more cautious, fearful because of where we've been, conscious of where we are now, and nervous of doing too much too soon.

There can be a real danger of Christians fracturing over this. I've been struck by Paul's words to the Christians in Rome, quoted above, as they too had differences of opinion and conscience. We all worship the same Lord, who gives endurance and encouragement – and how we've needed those - and who can help us all see each other, whatever our opinion, as Christ sees us.

We are planning to go ahead this summer carefully, cautiously, in line with government guidance and in consultation with all relevant bodies. There is real joy to be able to meet again with other Christians, and it's wonderful to be able to have something to look forward to.

It would be wonderful if we could all be in prayer for the Convention. More details about a prayer day are below.

Convention 2021

We're planning with caution and optimism and looking forward to seeing you at this year's Keswick Convention (17 July - 6 August).

The Government's roadmap confirms that the Convention can go ahead this year as the restrictions ease, but due to Covid it will be a different year to normal. We

understand that some may not want to attend but equally we know that many others are looking forward to meeting together in Keswick again.

Speakers are booked and there's lots of work happening behind the scenes to get ready for the Convention.

We are looking forward to holding the three-week event for the first time on the Pencil Factory and Rawnsley sites in Keswick and are making sure that all our plans are in line with Government guidance on best practice as lockdown is lifted.

Due to uncertainties around international travel, there are changes to the Bible Readers in Weeks One and Two.

Alistair Begg, who was due to travel from the USA to give the Bible Readings in Week One, will now speak at next year's Convention. We are pleased to welcome Paul Mallard who will do the Morning Bible Readings instead, on Philippians.

Simon Manchester was due to travel from Australia for the Morning Bible readings in Week Two. He is now set to speak at next year's Convention. Tim Chester will give the Morning Bible Readings instead, looking from Exodus at "The History of the World in Five Meals."

We are very thankful to them for being gracious and flexible as we plan for this year's Convention - and next year too! Paul and Tim had been due to speak in 2020, and had already swapped to 2022, before this latest change.

This year's adult programme will also include Evening Celebrations, Keswick Lectures and a selection of Seminars, as well as programmes for families and youth, all based on the theme of Faithful.

Each week, the Evening Celebrations will explore God's faithfulness and ours by unpacking different parts of the Bible.

In Week One (17 -23 July), we will focus on God's faithfulness in all circumstances, by looking at a number of the Psalms. The speakers will be Jeremy McQuoid, James Robson, Andrew Sach, Alasdair Paine, Gavin Calver and Efrem Buckle.

In Week Two (24 - 30 July), we will travel together through Luke 1 and 2, looking at themes including God's faithfulness in preparing the way, celebrating the faithful saviour God and consolation and comfort from a suffering saviour. Speakers include Jeremy McQuoid, Martin Salter and Rico Tice.

In the final week, (31 July - 6 August) speakers will delve into Revelation 1-3. The talks include Jesus Christ: The all-glorious faithful witness, a truth-holding church, a living church and a Christ-dependent church. James Robson, Andy Robinson, Jason Roach, Pete Nicholas and Andy Prime will be speaking.

Details about all speakers and the topics for this summer's Convention are available on the link below.

One of the most important changes at this year's event will be registration for adults and families. This means that, if we need to reduce venue capacity, we can still ensure everyone gets to participate.

Youth (11-18's) will also need to register separately for their activities.

We plan to open registration mid-to-late April and will email when it opens. Also do keep an eye on our website, newsletters and social media feeds – and we'll update you with the latest plans for the 2021 Keswick Convention.

We have an exciting Children and Youth programme planned for this year – though due to Covid – it will be slightly different from a usual Convention.



Each morning there is a Families

Together event for children under 11 and their families. This includes Bible teaching, songs, and activities around tables. Families Together replaces the usual Keswick 4 Kids and will be held in the morning seminar slot – but don't worry – seminars are recorded so you can catch up!

On Sunday we'll hold our traditional all-age service.

Keswick Youth, for those aged 11-18, will run every weekday morning. This will include small-group Bible Studies, resources and teaching. Also some of the Convention seminars will be particularly relevant to youth.

In Week Three, the youth programme also features a daily (Sunday to Friday) live evening celebration – plus it will be livestreamed so young people around the UK and further afield can join in. There will also be some evening youth provision in Weeks One and Two.

Pipework and panels have been installed for the new toilets on the ground floor of the Pencil Factory. Walls have been built and underfloor heating has been laid.

This is part of Phase One of the project, which is due to be completed for this summer's convention. The whole phase of work includes the installation of toilets, meeting rooms, large multi-purpose areas and a reception to the ground floor as well as installing power and heating throughout the building.

It's fantastic to see work taking place, so that the purpose of the Derwent project - securing the Convention's future and expanding the ministry of spiritual refreshment - comes closer to fruition.

Encouraged through Teaching and Training events

We are very thankful to have been able to run different online Teaching and Training events to support local churches and provide training opportunities for key areas for ministry. Even in

lockdown, many people have engaged in courses and benefited from them.

Jeremy Hobson recently attended a Bible Workshop in Hebrew (Up to intermediate level). He said: "This is a hugely encouraging day for local church leaders like me, both to be reminded about biblical languages, and to be refreshed in the Lord. I can't recommend it highly enough."

In addition to this full day course, online monthly workshops have been taking place. They have all been led by Ministry Director James Robson. The sessions have been a great encouragement to attendees as they explore God's Word in its original language, so it is fresh for them in their hearts, lives and ministries.



Enjoyable and challenging Bible workshop

We were delighted to hold an online Bible workshop about the Sermon on the Mount, led by Rev Dr Ben Cooper, tutor at Cornhill Training Course.

Attendees from all over the UK took part in the sessions on Zoom. Most attendees -

though not all - were involved in some form of Christian leadership or teaching.

Ben said: "The aim of the workshop was to engage afresh with the Sermon on the Mount, to see its function within the context of Matthew's Gospel as a whole, and to move towards a more positive understanding of these chapters - one in which we delight in the challenge of living to the praise of our heavenly Father, and in which we lean on him all the more, especially in prayer.

"We met on Zoom (of course!), but despite all the challenges of online interaction, we did all relax and get to know each other a little. By the beginning of the second day, the questions and discussion had begun to flow. Most of all I think we all felt deeply spoken to by God through this most precious part of his Word."

Participant Anne Beverley enjoyed the workshop, saying it was "thoroughly enjoyable and challenging".


Faith in the Second Half, 11th- 13th May (online)
