Convention 2021

With only a few weeks to go until the 2021 Keswick Convention (17 July - 6 August), which this year through the Derwent Project will be on one site for the first time, your prayers are much appreciated as we make the final arrangements.

The pandemic means there are a number of changes this year as we follow Government guidelines. We have introduced a registration and booking system to help us manage social distancing and venue capacities (see below for more details).

This year's Convention offers a programme of Morning Bible Readings, Seminars, Keswick Lectures and Evening Celebrations.

It is also an opportunity to take a break from the busyness of life and enjoy some time away in beautiful Keswick, in the heart of the Lake District. Be encouraged to come to the Convention for a time of refreshment.

What's different at this summer's Convention

Online registration has been launched to help with our planning and give us an idea
of numbers. We're asking you to let us know which week you plan to attend and
which sessions you'd like to go to. If you haven't already registered, please do so
here. The closing date for registering interest is 31st May.

- We will shortly be introducing a booking system for you to formally book your places
 if you've registered. More details will be sent out via email about this in the next
 couple of weeks.
- To keep everyone as safe and secure as possible, we're asking that every person attending the Convention has a lateral flow test on the Saturday and the Tuesday of the week they're attending.
- This year, the main sessions Morning Bible Readings and Evening Celebrations will be in three venues on the Pencil Factory site the former packing hall and two relay venues. We're running it this way because of Government limits on numbers in any given venue.
- During the Convention, Morning Bible Readings and Evening Celebrations will be livestreamed and available for catch up. For the first time, seminars will be also available for catch up. One will be streamed live.
- The Families Together is replacing the traditional Keswick 4 Kids stream. There are some changes to the Keswick Youth Programme. Take a look at this <u>video</u> by John Taylor, Keswick Ministries' trustee, as he shares what's happening over the three weeks with prayer points.

Hard-working volunteers help to makes sites ready for Convention

A small army of volunteers has been working hard to get the Pencil Factory and Rawnsley sites ready for the Convention.

They have carried out a host of jobs including making planters and picnic benches out of wooden beams that had been used in the Pencil Factory, as well clearing, tidying, painting, fitting toilets, digging and weeding.

It's a mammoth task to get the sites ready for Convention, but the teams of volunteers have put in a lot of hard work over the two-week stint. They have also had the chance to have fellowship with one another and join together for meals at the Convention Centre.

Murray Lawrie, Facilities Manager, said: "We are incredibly grateful for the volunteers who have given up their time to help on site. There has been a great feeling of camaraderie as everyone has pulled together to get a long list of tasks done."

"There is still more to do in the lead up to Convention and so more volunteering opportunities will be available mid-June. If you are interested in getting involved, email facilities@keswickministries.org"

He said that a great deal of work has been taking place on the site by contractors Thomas Armstrong to finish Phase 1 of the Derwent Project in time for the Convention.













Derwent Project finance update

Your partnership, alongside that of many others, enables the far-reaching work of Keswick Ministry, which began more than a century ago, to continue and grow, and for this we are very grateful. The funds raised so far for the Derwent Project will see the



Convention on one site for the first time this year; a major milestone indeed! We now have sufficient funds to complete Phase 1 of the work to refurbish the Pencil Factory, which will mean that the Youth teams will be able to use the spaces on the ground floor for their meetings and activities.

Phase 2 of the work will be to complete the first and second floors of the Pencil Factory. These will then be available for church weekends and our growing teaching and training programme, as well as for the Convention. In order to carry out this work we now need to raise a further £600,000.

Please would you consider making a one-off donation to help us achieve this goal? We hope to begin Phase 2 this October, but can only do so once the finance is in place.




