

Keswick Convention 2022

Plans are gathering pace for next summer's Keswick Convention (16th July - 5th August). Speakers are being booked and others are due to be confirmed.

In Week One (16th - 22nd July), Morning Bible Readings will be given by Alistair Begg, the Keswick Lecture will be given by Glynn Harrison, who will speak on the rise of the 'me' culture, and sung worship will be led by Emu Music.

In Week Two, (23rd - 29th July), Morning Bible Readings will be given by Jeremy McQuoid, Krish Kandiah will speak at the Keswick Lecture on the theme of Grateful for the Opportunity: positive engagement in the public sphere, and sung worship will be led by Ben Slee and band.

In Week Three (30th July - 5th August), Morning Bible Readings will be led by Mike Cain, John Stevens will speak at the Keswick Lecture about the state of Evangelicalism, and sung worship will be led by Olly Knight and band.

Work is taking place to confirm speakers for the seminars and evening celebrations for across the three weeks. Keep a look out on our website and social media, in the New Year, for updates.

It will be an encouraging time to meet together as we explore the theme of Grateful.

We are looking forward to being on one site, in one large marquee on site and using the whole of the Pencil Factory building, including the first and second floors which are set to be revamped in time for the Convention. We don't feel that registration and booking will be necessary for the Convention.

Encouraging Teaching & Training programme

Be refreshed to serve

Participants have been enjoying a host of teaching and training events in Keswick.

Gaining a better understanding of the coherence and implications of biblical doctrine was the aim of a recent Doctrine Study Day.

Dr Garry Williams & Dr Neil Martin spoke about 'Preaching the God-man, defending & delighting in the incarnation'.

Among the seventeen participants was Peter Walkingshaw, pastor of Carlisle Baptist Church. He said: "In the day-to-day busyness of being involved in church ministry it's not always easy to take time out to think about things that are beyond a crisis in the church or next Sunday's sermon. It's been lovely to step aside for a day."

A Preaching Workshop has also been held. Twelve church leaders joined an intensive workshop to build on their skills for delivering biblical and engaging sermons. The workshop was led by Richard Garnett and James Robson.

Rev Jo McKee, of St Andrew's Radcliff in Manchester and CPAS director of the Arrow Leadership Programme, said: "It's a privilege to take a couple of days away to pause & to be challenged to think about teaching in a different way especially as the world around us has changed so much."

Finance update


As we come to the end of 2021, this is a great opportunity to share this financial update with you.






Catch up on our podcasts
