Japan

Timothy Konishi writes: Our Japan Keswick Ministries has a history of over 60 years. It started near Tokyo, and has now spread across all 6 districts of the country. Due to Covid-19 we have not been able to hold 'live' events during 2021 and 2022, but some districts used videos of the preachers who were due to visit. Plans are being made for 2023, and the visits of John Oswalt, David Olford and Ian & Ruth Coffey. **Please**

- 1. Covid is not yet over, and many people have been uncertain about travel. Please pray for good numbers at the 2023 events.
- 2. Japan Keswick is supported mainly by participant's offerings, but following two years with no events, our financial situation is difficult.

India

- D P Poddar writes: By God's grace, Calcutta Keswick has sustained 65 years of teaching the Word. Typically meetings take place in the second week of February, and include a Saturday Breakfast for around 750, morning Bible Studies in English, and evening messages with Bengali translation. Covid meant that in 2021and 2022 meetings were reduced, and were online. **Please pray:**


Cayman

The **Cayman Keswick** has been running since 1974, and continues to attract believers from across the denominations. Jamaica

The Kingston Keswick Council hosts its annual Convention from January 22-29, 2023, writes Dr Evadnie Sterling. It will be a hybrid event, with plans for evening gatherings, lunch hour Bible studies, youth and children's rallies, men and women's events, and a special pastors' forum. We will also be engaging the 8 other Keswick Conventions operating in Jamaica. We are seeking to strengthen partnerships with the local and regional Keswicks, and would be glad of prayer for a possible National Keswick Convention and a regional conference.









Hungary

BalatonNet is the name for Keswick Hungary. Attila Kapocs writes that they have selected the annual theme as Healthy Community-Healthy Fellowship, since so many churches have been impacted negatively by Covid. Please pray that BalatonNet will be able to bring encouragement and renewal. Last year they held a 2 day event for 450 people, but this year plan for a full 5 day event for 1500 people. **Please pray** for accommodation for volunteers; for the much-needed income, given the higher costs; for new team members to help lead; and for good numbers to attend.



South Africa

The **Durban Keswick** is held in September each year, and Greg Denysschen reports that, when Covid hit, they used the live stream from the UK Keswick, which was very effective. Sadly, they lost some of their faithful team members through Covid. They also had serious social unrest in Durban, followed by 2 devastating floods. 'Never has our poor country been in greater need of a visitation from God, which the Keswick Convention is well placed to facilitate.' Please pray as the team plans for the future; for the many volunteers needed; for God's blessing on their work.

Finland

The incoming Secretary, Stefan Salonen, reports that the Keswick Fellowship in Finland is indeed alive and well! A new team is taking the work forward. New Zealand
