1 Corinthians 15:51-52 Romans 8:29

[Jesus Christ] gave himself for us to redeem us from all wickedness and to purify for himself a people that are his very own, eager to do what is good. (Titus 2:14)

Sanctification

Positional - And by that will we **have been sanctified** through the offering of the body of Jesus Christ once for *all*. (Hebrews 10:10)

Progressive - [We] *are being transformed* into his image with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit (2 Corinthians 3:18)

Some problems with change....

A man called Dave...32 yr old Christian; overstretched at work; marriage under strain; spiritually struggling & missing small group; Flirting with female colleague; realises close to getting sexually involved. Talks to church friend Andy – sympathises over pressures; agrees it's difficult to get work / life balance

Discuss: how true to life is this picture? What problem with change might it reveal?

More of Dave....Dave talks to church elder, Brian – advised to flee temptation (1 Cor 6:18) and change job. Seems radical but that's what Dave decides to do.

Discuss: what problem with change might this reveal?

2. B_____ our C_____ (when the real problem _____)

"What comes out of a person is what defiles them. For it is from within, out of a person's heart, that evil thoughts come—sexual immorality, theft, murder, adultery, greed, malice, deceit, lewdness, envy, slander, arrogance and folly. All these evils come from inside and defile a person." (Mark 7:20-23)

More of Dave... 6 months later; same thing happens again; close to sexual involvement with a work colleague; Dave seeks out his pastor; advised to manage this spiritually: disciplined devotional life; small gp priority; time with wife; Dave is chastened and sets out to change

Discuss: what problem with change might this reveal?

3. S_____ for E_____ Change (when the real problem is _____)

Woe to you, teachers of the law and Pharisees, you hypocrites! You clean the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of greed and self-indulgence. Blind Pharisee! First clean the inside of the cup and dish, and then the outside also will be clean. (Matthew 23:25-6)

4. M_____ M_____ (when what's needed is a change in our _____)

When we do not think about characteristic motivations, [a person's] 'relationship with God' tends to be approached chiefly through outward disciplines: devotional life, church attendance, and the like. When we do address the motivational issues biblically, [a person's] relationship with God becomes [an] issue we can get our hands on.
