Changing Church

Ephesians 4:11-16

1. Through the ministry of 'one-anothering'

Ephesians 4 church

God gave the apostles, the prophets, the evangelists, the pastors and teachers...

to equip his people...

for works of service [ministry]...

that the body of Christ might be built up...

and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the fullness of Christ.

- 2. By closing the 'gaps'
- 'Gospel Gap'
- 'Ministry Gap'



Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths, but only what is helpful for building others up according to their needs, that it may benefit those who listen. (Ephesians 4:29)

3. Training some to bless many

The final break-through to fellowship does not occur, because though they have fellowship with one another as believers and as devout people, they do not have fellowship as the undevout, as sinners. The pious fellowship permits no one to be a sinner. Life Together, Dietrich Bonhoeffer

Discuss: If we wanted to improve the quality (and honesty) of the conversational ministry going on in our churches, what could we do?

- Rethink prayer ministry
