Other Notes

Danger of debt

- Huge spiralling temptation for some (credit cards, buy-now-pay-later schemes, pay-day loans, theft)
- Enslaves
- Get help CAP Money Course budgeting skills
- Increases temptation for theft

Fraud triangle

- Motivation/Pressure eg Difficult financial situation
- **Opportunity –** eg Weaknesses in financial control
- Rationalisation eg No-one will miss the money
